

Pumpkin Carving with Craft Club

Our magazine club merged with craft club last week to get involved with some Halloween crafting, thanks to Miss Kissane and Mrs Betts. We made pumpkins out of paper, and the instructions have been written up by Evan and Jayden, if you want to have a go too. You can see how ours turned out!

Step 1: Cut a piece of orange paper in to 12 equal strips

Step 2: Stick these strips together by the ends, so they make a star shape (see picture)

Step 3: Hole punch the end of each strip


Step 4: Make a think tube out of green paper, to be the stalk, and thread this through one of the holes


Step 5: Gluing the end of each strip as you go, thread each hole through the stem and stick the tops of the strips together, to make a ball shape
