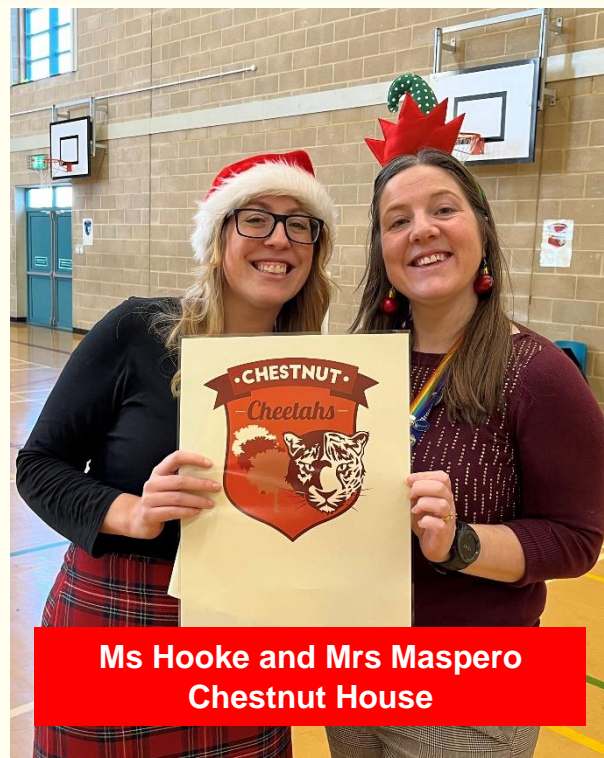


We finished the day with a whole school sing along to Merry Christmas Everyone with the fantastic Year 7 choir!

Independent Study Club

Each school day we have an Independent Study Club.

It runs in C1 from 3-4 pm, except Friday where it runs to 3:30 pm.

- Referred by teacher - teachers will encourage attendance if a student is struggling with their Independent Study
- Brought by member of staff from detention if work incomplete.

Students will have access to computers to complete work. Copies of knowledge organisers will be available to support Independent Study tasks and Ms Parkes will be there to support, answer questions, she will also send e-mails to staff if further support is required.
