Rita Person, a great educationalist, used to drill into all her students that, as the quote above shows, they were somebody, they were powerful, that they had people to impress and places to go.

I used this quote with our Year 11s yesterday as they had their final assembly together. It was a wonderful event and you can read about it in the year group update but as representatives of all our young people, they are impressive!

I recalled that when they joined us in Year 7 Donald Trump became President of the USA, when they were in Year 8 the #metoo movement began, when they were in Year 9 the climate agenda came to the fore with the Beast from the East followed in 2020 by Greta Thunberg's visit to Bristol.

When they were in Year 10 the advent of Black Lives Matter, the toppling of Colston's statue and the protests here in Weston marked key moments for this year group. In Year 11, students were challenged by the dissonance around examinations because of Covid here in the UK.

As the world changed and convulsed, our students demanded we change too and do better. Because of them there is deep work underway about what it means to be a decent citizen of Broadoak Academy, of Weston, of the UK, of the world - They leave an impressive legacy of resilience and a call for change. A call students in other year groups will fulfil in the coming months and years.


Introducing.... Spruce House!

Being a student at PQA (Pauline Quirke Academy of Performing Arts) has been a wonderful opportunity and has helped me develop my social and leadership skills, as well as helping me discover more about the performing arts while meeting so many new and passionate people. When I was first offered a scholarship to PQA, I was absolutely thrilled as I have always loved drama and music — but I was unsure on what to expect. I have never been the most confident person but on my first day I was met with so many friendly faces and exciting experiences that I couldn't help but feel absolutely at home. Every week at PQA you study three subjects — Film and Television, Comedy and Drama and Musical Theatre. I would pick a favourite, but I honestly enjoyed aspects of all three — from analysing and recreating iconic movie scenes in Film and TV, to creating exciting performances in Musical Theatre and working in groups to develop fun sketches in Comedy and Drama, there is truly something for everyone!

PQA provides its students with a variety of opportunities to improve their skills and confidence, one of my favourites was performing with G4 in a Christmas carol concert in Wells Cathedral. It was a great experience and along the way we all learned so many skills and developed our skills as vocal performers, as well as our teamwork and general performance etiquette. Even if (like me) you aren't aiming for a career in the Performing Arts, gaining these experiences can seriously improve your confidence and teamwork skills that will be useful in any career, and you get to have a lot of fun along the way! For everyone who is pursuing a career in acting, film etc, there are also many ways to branch out into a career; we talked to a BBC presenter to gain valuable insights into jobs in television and rehearsals for Musical Theatre productions are always educational as the teachers are very well trained and can offer specialist insight and advice about performance skills. Furthermore, some of my friends have joined PQA's Creative Management company, which can provide valuable audition opportunities and we were able to use professional cameras to record scenes in Film and Television.

If you are not very sure of your skills as a dancer, singer, actor or filmmaker, the academy provides frequent support and welcomes students of all skill and experience levels. You are not expected to be perfect at everything but when you do improve, your achievements are acknowledged and celebrated, such as when three students are chosen each week to be recognised for their improvement and skills in the three different modules.

I would also like to extend my sincere thanks to all the lovely staff at PQA, as well as the students whose talents and kindness I will never forget. The teachers there are all so skilled and passionate about their subjects that every Saturday was something to look forward to, and their care for the students is so genuine that it is heart-warming to see. The students were also very encouraging and meeting so many new and talented people has really expanded my horizons!

I wish you all the best and hopefully you will have many more rewarding experiences in the years to come :)




