
### 44kg of food donated to Weston Foodbank

Weston Foodbank said they were amazed at the generosity of just one class of teenagers. Well done 9C – house points for Chestnut!








### **Broadoak Academy presents Mary Poppins Jr!**

### **Tender Workshops at Broadoak Academy**


Last week, a group of Year 9 students worked with an amazing charity called Tender

a charity that are trying to end domestic abuse.

During the 2-day workshop project, we looked at healthy and unhealthy relationships and how people may feel and act in those different types of relationships. We also looked the 5 different types of abuse (physical, sexual, cyber, financial and psychological / emotional) and how people may also react and feel with those types of abuse.



We watched a short film about a girl who got pressured to send a sexual image and after we watched the film we had a discussion about signs of abuse that we saw in the film. We also worked with scripts and we made an assembly for the rest of Year 9 which we recorded. The scripts were different conversations, sometimes the characters argue or they have done something bad or it's a break up.



Once again a big thank you to Tender for coming to our school and telling us about their amazing organisation and thank you to everything they have done.






### Realising Talent Programme Year 10, Year 11 and Beyond...

Over the last year, Youth Connect Southwest, through the Realising Talent Programme, has been working with a small group of students at Broadoak Academy as they look forward to their next steps after Year 11.

The programme involves a mixture of group and 1:1 mentoring sessions each term. These sessions have included undertaking some fun challenges, thinking about key employability skills and support for the students while they searched and secured valuable work experience placements at the end of Year 10.



As they have moved into Year 11 the students have been able to chat through their options and have support to make those tricky decisions and applications for post-16

education. During the year the students have also had the chance to have sessions led by local employers including Persimmons Homes and most recently Chris from Babcock who the students were very engaged with as he explained the wide variety of apprenticeships at Babcock and the application process.



The students have been a great credit to the school and several of them participated in interviews with the Behaviour Insights Team from London who are undertaking research into career guidance from a national perspective.

As 2023 progresses, Youth Connect, through the programme, will continue to offer support for these students as they take their first steps beyond Broadoak Academy.




# **Apprenticeships & Technical Education Roadshow Evening for Parents and Carers**

### Wonders of Weston – Wellbeing Walks

Why not go out and about around Weston to see the rich history of the town.

Walking is simple, free and one of the easiest ways to get more active, lose weight and become healthier.

Sometimes overlooked as a form of exercise, walking briskly can help you build stamina, burn excess calories and make your heart healthier.

### Gems of Weston walk

Stunning Victorian architecture can be spotted all around Weston-super-Mare's town centre.

Discover some highlights of this beautiful seaside town by following this short walk.

This walk was developed by North Somerset Council, in partnership with Weston Civic Society and the Health Walks initiative. Funded by Historic England High Street Heritage Action Zone.

Begin the walk at the Grade II listed Weston-super-Mare railway station – opened in 1884 on a new loop which replaced the 1841 branch line. Brunel's Grade II listed signal box is in the adjacent car park as a reminder of the previous trackway.

? From the station, go over the zebra crossing onto Station Road and note the row of 1930s Art Deco houses on your left . Walk past local architect Hans Fowler Price's French-style depository, which has been a storage facility for

over 100 years. Hans Price was the architect responsible for much of the development of Weston-super-Mare during the Victorian era and much of his work can be discovered throughout the town centre.

Behind the 20m Pennant and Ham stone tower of Victoria Methodist Church is the 190-year-old Whitecross Lodge, former home of Richard Parsley who built Weston's first hotel.

4 As you continue towards the town centre, you will pass the 1934 former

magistrates' court, which has been used for several television dramas. At the road junction look left towards Walliscote Primary School, built in 1897 by Hans Price as Weston's first 'board school'.

Turn right past the Italianate Town Hall, opened in 1859, extended by Hans Price in 1897, further extended in 'Post Office Georgian' in 1927, and the brick wing added in 1980.

Walking towards Regent Street you pass The Centre, a row of recently repainted Art Deco shops and apartments, finishing with Cecil Howitt's modernist 1935 Odeon cinema.

 Opposite the Odeon, is Alexandra Parade, an elongated open space previously known as The Plantation. This is where Weston's first railway station opened in 1841. The scale replica locomotive North Star, installed in 2006, commemorates the 200th anniversary of Isambard Kingdom Brunel's birth.

The original station hotel is now the Tavern Inn the Town pub. From here head towards Big Lamp Corner and Silica, a piece of public art designed by Wolfgang Buttress in 2006. From here you can see several impressive buildings, particularly Costa Coffee (can you spot the elephants?) and HSBC bank. 10

As you walk along the High Street, look up above shop level at the variety of windows, carvings and other details. At the far end, the newly refurbished Italian Gardens provides a spot to sit and relax among the classical balustrading, fountains and lawns. Spot the 1807 Royal Hotel and Olea restaurant and bar. These were both Weston's first hotels. Also SASS bar, an 1860s former bank in Florentine palazzo style; the new University Centre at the Winter Gardens; and the 1992 Sovereign, a recently renovated mix use space with an attractive cafe, cycle hub, retail and work space. 🕕

2 Turn right into Waterloo Street and the Boulevard. Spot the former office of the Weston and Somerset Mercury newspaper and adjacent buildings, together with the Constitutional Club (former Masonic Lodge of St Kew), and the row of shops, all by Hans Price in the 1880s. Turn next right into Orchard Street – a busy road of independent businesses: florist, Asian and East European food stores and restaurants, craft and dress shops. In adjacent Burlington Street is Weston Museum, superby redesigned in 2017. This hub of independent retailing extends into Meadow Street. 10

At the end of Orchard Street you'll find yourself back in Alexandra Parade where steps can be easily retraced to the railway station.


