Our Values

At Broadoak we develop a culture and approach from the students and staff under our mantra of Time, Courage and Choice.



We value Time; time does not stand still, and we must make the most of it with everything we do. Time allows us to think, to make sensible choices. Time allows us to heal from sadness. Time is a gift that we can use for good in so many ways. We must ensure that we value time, from being on time to our learning, to using time to our advantage when planning our learning and our next steps, in school, in our wider community and beyond. We must use time to help us become better people by not waiting to help others, but by going out and proactively contributing to our community and to the lives of those who live there.

We show Courage; it is easy to give up, to say I can't do it, to say it's too difficult, to hide behind the view that we are not good enough, to follow others in wrongdoing. It is easy to not make a big decision or not take an important step. It is easy to not speak out against bullying, prejudice and discrimination. It is easy to stand by and watch or listen whilst others are unkind. Not at Broadoak! We show courage and nurture our young people to show courage. We show the courage to keep going even though things are difficult. We show the courage to stand up against unkindness in whatever form it takes. Curriculum

The start of key stage three marks the beginning of an exciting phase for our students here at Broadoak.

It is the period when they build on their primary education and prepare for their key stage four choices. Our Year 7 curriculum is designed so that students can master the fundamentals in each subject, whilst maintaining breadth.

In order to give our students a broad and balanced learning experience at Broadoak, we offer a wide range of subjects throughout key stage three. As our values demonstrate, we believe in making the best use of our time, showing courage and making the right choices, therefore teaching is deliberately designed to challenge and support all students to exceed their potential, regardless of their starting points.

Our timetable is taught with 6 periods of 50 minute lessons per day. Here is the breakdown of the subjects that Year 7 students will study each week:

What happens next?



Once you accept your child's offer here at Broadoak, the transition work begins. Here is a summary of what this includes:



March onwards – We will be happy to answer any questions that you might have, and you are also more than welcome to visit the school again or meet with any of us on request. Please email transition@broadoakacademy.clf.uk

April, May and June - We will be visiting every single child and their Year 6 teacher in the primary schools. We will be gaining as much information as we can from your primary school including academic data, behaviour, likes and dislikes, friendships, extra-curricular interests and personality traits.

For any students with additional or special educational needs, our SEND Team will meet with our primary school counterparts to make sure that we have all the relevant information needed so that we can continue to meet your child's needs in the best possible way.

We will also have some pre-transition visits for selected students. They will come to Broadoak with a key member of staff from their primary school and will often work with their prospective Key Worker from Broadoak as well.

Week commencing 1st July - The Big Step Transition Week. Your child will be spending 3 days with us Tuesday 2nd to Thursday 4th July 2024. They will be following our timetable, experiencing a typical school day at Broadoak, meeting with their tutors and some of their new teachers, making new friends and gaining confidence throughout.

Thursday, 4th July 5.30-6.30pm - Parent and Carer Information Evening - You are warmly invited to join us and celebrate what the students have been doing during transition week. You will be able to see some of their new learning and we will be presenting a video of the three days experience at Broadoak Academy. During the evening you will also be able to meet your child's new Tutor and House Team.
