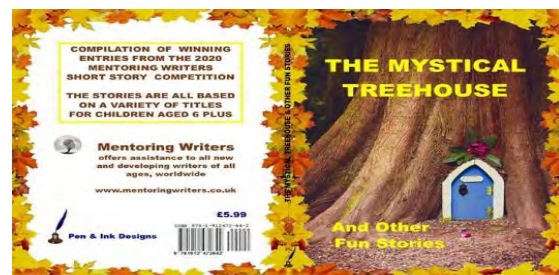

- 1862 - The first Gay & Lesbian Fraternities.
- 1909 - The Rainbow flag is used to represent a new era and social change.
- 1969 - The Stonewall riots in America - A series of spontaneous, violent demonstrations by members of the LGBT community against a police raid on the Stonewall Inn.
- 1972 - The first PRIDE march is held in London, attracting approximately 2,000 participants.
- 1972 - The first gay newspaper was founded in Britain.
- 1974 - The first national TV/Ts conference is held in Leeds.
- 1980 - The first Black, Gay and Lesbian group is formed in the UK.
- 1983 - The UK's first national lesbian and gay TV show is shown on Channel 4.

- 1988 - WHO declares same sex attraction as a mental illness.

- 1992 was the first time any sitting Prime Minister has met with LGBT activists.
- British serial killer, Colin Ireland, is convicted of killing five gay men. He is sentenced to life in prison.
- In 2002 equal rights are granted to same-sex couples applying for adoption.
- Statement began in Great Britain in 1912 when the first woman changed gender.

Teachers have been busy compiling a detailed information booklet and putting together the:

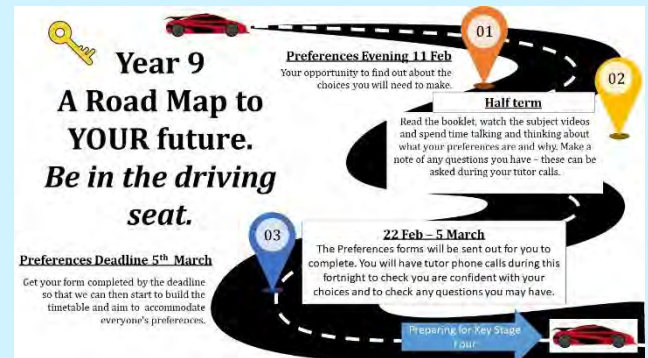

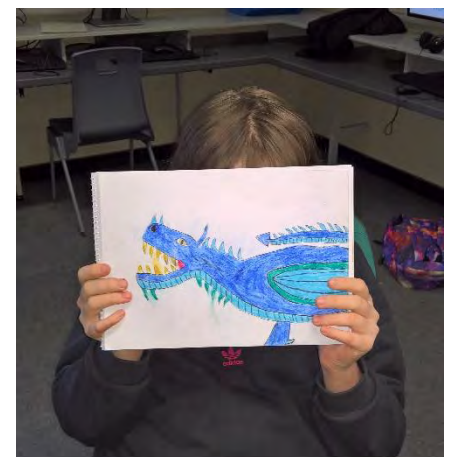


Children's Mental Health Week

Launched by the Duchess of Cambridge, Children's Mental Health week took place during the first week of February.

A variety of activities took place from playing musical instruments, poetry writing and baking. Some students made inside out boxes. The outside of a box is decorated in a way which represents your public self and the inside is decorated to represent your inner most thoughts and feelings.

Students also did some impressive art work. Students reported that being creative in lockdown had a positive impact on their mental health.

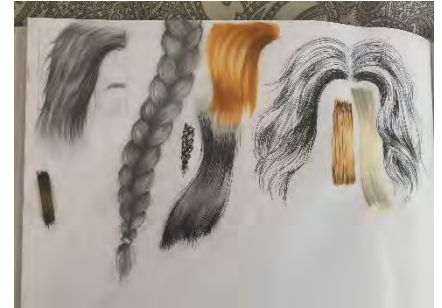
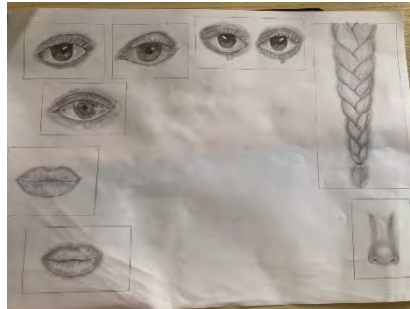


Year 11 Art Experimenting & Developing Ideas

A T Level provides an equivalent qualification to an A level for 16-19 year olds who would rather study work related courses than traditional subjects.

A T Level is delivered over two years, the same as an A level. They contain a work placement of at least 45 days.
